You must meet both A and B of the following requirements.

Academic transcripts for all subjects you have taken during grade 10, grade 11, and the first semester of grade 12 at your high school2. "學生個人成績暨排名百分比對照表" issued by your high school in the "大學甄選入學繁星推薦" format designated by the "大學甄選入學委員會", which shows the academic grades for all semesters in grade 10, grade 11, and the first semester of grade 12. * Your "總平均" must be ranked within the top 40%, and your "英文" must be ranked within the top 30%. * "學生個人成績暨分數百分比對照表" must be original with official seal of your school. Certification offered by the "大學甄選入學委員會" is not necessary. * If you studied in several schools, submit the documents that have same content as "學生個人成績暨分數百分比對照表" of all the high schools in which you studied.
B	<p>English Proficiency Test Score Submit one of the following English proficiency test results; * Scores more than two years old cannot be accepted. Please refer to the Application Guide for the specific dates.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. TOEFL (iBT)*: 86 points or higher ONLY scores sent directly from the organization will be considered valid. Arrange to have your score directly sent from ETS.

◆ English Essay

- Write an essay in English on your own in accordance with the following instructions.

Identify a significant international event which took place in the last year and explain why you think it was important. Explain your choice within 600 words.

◆ Academic Honors & Extra-curricular Activities

- If you would like to tell us your academic honors or extra-curricular activities, choose up to three honors/activities as you think best in order. (150-200 words for each honor/activity)
- Information to be entered in these fields are limited to experience acquired **after graduating from junior high school or completing the first half of secondary schooling.**
- **Up to three activities** can be entered in the designated form. Choose the best according to your experiences.
- Prepare a PDF version of a certificate, brochure, article or other document to prove your activities. (It can be photocopies but make sure to prepare a certificate that bears the name of the applicant and period of activities / honors.) You also may use the following template.

Notes of fees and payment:

- The amount of fees indicated above is subject to change.
- From the second year on, the School Expenses and other fees include Tuition and Waseda University Student Health Promotion Mutual Aid Association Fees (Student Health Insurance Fee). In addition, JPY 40,000 for the Alumni Association Membership Fee (automatic enrollment in the Alumni Association for up to 10 years after graduation) is required for the fourth year.
- Waseda University uses an automatic account transfer system for payment of School Expenses and other fees. School Expenses and other fees for the spring semester are scheduled to be deducted from your registered bank account on May 5. From the second year on, School Expenses and other fees for the fall semester will be deducted from your registered bank account on October 5. If financial institutions are closed on May 5 or October 5 due to public holiday or the like, the account transfer will be processed on the next following business day.
